PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Greetings!

One of our biggest events for the GSDS has now come and gone: our Smiles From the Heart Auction on February 22 was a great success. Thanks to the many members who helped contribute to that success, from those who helped with the organization and planning efforts to those

who contributed their dollars to the Foundation. I want to especially thank Drs. Alan Rosen and Pat Bauer for heading up the auction committee. I also want to thank Jean Harmison, not only for work on the auction, but also for everything else she and her staff do for our society.

There were 275 attendees at the event, and though the final numbers are not quite in, we raised \$103,000 to go towards the charitable works of the Greater Springfield Dental Foundation. Many good things will come over the next few years from the support of those dollars. What a great thing to be proud of!

MDA Legislative Day was February 27 in Jefferson City. Attendance was down this year, but those who did attend had some good conversations with legislators. Medicaid Carve Out, capped fees, and fluoridation in communities were among the items discussed. There is still much debate occurring in regards to Medicaid expansion and the ACA. Legislators want to know about issues you are concerned about, and they want you to let them know what you think. Make the effort to get to know them and share your knowledge on these dental issues with them.

Everyone should have received an email update from the MDA regarding rule changes for Expanded Function Dental Assistants (EFDAs). These changes incorporate two primary issues: new permit rules for EFDAs (whether they have already completed the requirements or not), and a new Restorative II classification that allows for placing any classification of filling restoration or material. I encourage everyone to review these changes and take appropriate steps with your own EFDAs.

The Give Kids a Smile Program is in full swing; The school

system is working on getting needed treatment to kids who qualify, so if you haven't signed up to help, please do so by contacting the GSDS office. To those who have helped, thanks. If you feel inclined, we'd love to hear any unique stories about your GKAS experience this year.

New Dentists: A great opportunity for some Continuing Education and networking this summer has been planned specifically with you in mind. Join new dentists from around the state June 28-29 at Lake of the Ozarks Lodge of Four Seasons. Look for more information to come from the MDA, and make plans to come.

The Greater Springfield Dental Society General Membership Business Meeting will be held on April 5, in conjunction with the OSHA training meeting. We do this every year, with the purpose of approving the next year's budget and slate of officers, along with any other business deemed necessary. I encourage you to attend.

MOMOM is May 2-4 at the Show-Me Center in Cape Girardeau. Please help make this event a success by registering to volunteer. Dentists are needed! Sign up today at www.modental.org. Registration has been streamlined so that those who volunteered in Springfield do not have to re-enter all of their information. Bring your staff, and plan on a great weekend of giving back. 

DENTAL LEADERS GIVE US REASON TO SMILE

Often, opinion pieces in the newspaper cover topics that need to be addressed or improved. But sometimes it's equally as important to focus on what we're doing right — that is, a great dental health community taking care of the oral health needs of our greater Springfield neighbors.

Springfield has a rich history of dental health leaders who have identified problems and created solutions. In the last 20 years especially, we have been blessed to have dental health and other community leaders showcase their commitment to helping those who are less fortunate and in need of dental treatment.

I wish to shed light on these efforts because of the recent Smiles from the Heart Dinner and Auction hosted Feb. 22 by the Greater Springfield Dental Society and its foundation. Since 2006, the event (which occurs every three years) has raised more than \$125,000. This year, alone, it raised \$105,000.

These funds enable many of the programs that demonstrate commitment to improved oral health for the Springfield community ... something we all can celebrate! Highlights of these programs include:

- The Greater Springfield Dental Society, in partnership with the Ronald McDonald House Charities, started the tenth Tooth Truck in the world. The Society has raised \$234,000 for the truck, which has helped 14,000 families through 36,000 appointments worth \$8.2 million in treatment.
- The Stop the Pop campaign, marking 10 years last fall, originated from Springfield dentists and was adopted as a statewide campaign of the Missouri Dental Association (MDA). The program focuses on educating children and parents on the harmful effects of sweetened beverages on oral health, especially the acid and sugar combination in soda, and encourages limiting drink availability to kids at school.
- For more than 20 years, dental professionals have provided dental screenings for the Springfield Public School children health fair. This year, 12,000 children were screened by volunteer dentists and hygienists and referrals were made for children in desperate need of care before beginning the school year.
- The Charles L. and Dorothy Weaver Memorial Orthodontic Fund was established almost 25 years ago. Through the fund and through the pro bono work of local dentists, 107 patients have received complete orthodontic treatment to date.
- Springfield dentists and dental laboratories volunteer to take care of those with disabilities and the elderly in our community through the Donated Dental Services program. This is a statewide program where, in the last year alone, volunteers donated more than \$761,000 in dental care to 240 people in desperate need.
- In 2010 the Greater Springfield Dental Society hosted the first Missouri Mission of Mercy (MOMOM) charitable dental clinic. This event provided more than \$1.1 million in free care to nearly 2,000 patients by more than 1,000 volunteers. The success of this event has solidified its value and because of it, the MDA Foundation is hosting the second MOMOM May 3 and 4 at the Show-Me Center in Cape Girardeau.
- The Greater Springfield Dental Society continues to help facilitate dental care in our community by providing financial gifts and volunteers to the Children's Smile Center in Ozark and the Kitchen, where both children and adults receive dental treatment.

As a dentist, I'm so very grateful for personal and professional efforts made each day by the dental community, health care providers and community leaders in Springfield.

Looking ahead, I know that the Greater Springfield Dental Society will continue its commitment to seek viable solutions in an effort to deliver oral health care safely, effectively and efficiently for the betterment of the Springfield community and the state

The OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen Standard requires that employers who have employees with occupational exposure to blood and other potential infectious material provide training for those employees annually.

The training must take place within 12 months of previous training on the standard. This program will fulfill as much of the annual training requirement as possible.

The standard contains fifteen elements that must be addressed in the training and the program will cover fourteen of them. The major exception is that the standard does not require an annual review of the employer's exposure control plan. This portion of the requirement will need to occur in the participants' individual office setting. However, a discussion of the elements required in all plans will be included.


